Jayhawk Big Bird Fly-In September 25 and 26, 2008

John Caolie and I went to the Jayhawk Big Bird Fly-in at Lawrence, KS on September 25th. The field is very easy to get to and only took us about an hour even though there was some road construction on I-435. The first thing we noticed was that there was a lot of open space for flying. They really have a nice setup; shelter house, bleachers, chain link fencing separating the spectator area from the pit area and another chain link fence separating the pits from the pilot stands and runway. Perhaps the best thing about the field is that they have both an east/west runway and a north/south runway. Both runways are well manicured grass. They also have a very nice PA system. They have four speakers attached to what appeared to be 2 foot squares of boards strategically placed on the ground to provide adequate sound for the spectators and pits. They utilize a wireless microphone system that allows the PA announcer to mingle amongst the pilots and spectators. Their announcers did an excellent job of providing information about the pilots and their models. They also interviewed several children making them feel welcome and passed out small punch-out foam airplanes to each one.

John and I chose to be spectators at the event and enjoyed a great day of watching some very good pilots put on a show with their models. The event was listed as a Big Bird event but they had models from small electric power models to what appeared to be a 40-50 percent scale model. There was at least one model in the air at all times, sometimes three or four. We saw a lot of nice models and watched some very good pilots. The announcer stated that they were going to quit flying about 5:00pm, go eat dinner and return about 8:00pm for some night flying. The night flying sounded interesting but John and I chose not to stay. We had a fun time and decided we would bring planes next time.

AMA INSIDER

Soldering Advisories

Someone suggested that the use of a soldering gun was safer than other types because it would not roll off the workbench and burn you. It should also be mentioned over and over that soldering guns have a very strong alternating current magnetic field around the tip. When brought in proximity to electric motors and servos, this magnetic field de-gausses (demagnetizes) the magnets inside the motors and servos and causes permanent damage.

I have seen several people come to the flying field with a new electric-powered airplane that does not have enough power for flight. When asked if they soldered the wires to the motor with a soldering gun, the answer is usually "yes."

Also you should never stick the tip of a soldering gun into the airplane's radio compartment while soldering pushrods and etc. as it will presently damage the motors inside the servos.

If you must use a soldering gun, you should stay well away from electric motors and servos, meaning at least 24 inches just to be safe


